JEWELLERY POLICY

Introduction:

This Policy applies to the entire setting including the EYFS and after school and holiday clubs.

Wearing of Jewellery:

In the interest of safety, we encourage children **NOT** to wear jewellery in school. Jewellery can present a risk to the wearer and to others and our aim is to keep children safe from harm at school.

In general:

- Children may wear a plain watch to school, but must take it off for physical activities including PE.
- Smart watches which allow access to email and messaging services are not allowed.
- Children may wear one pair of earrings (**Small studs only**) to school. These should be taken out or covered by tape for physical activities.
- No other jewellery should be worn at school.
- Hair accessories, such as headbands, must be small and sensible and should be in school colours of blue or green.
- Appropriate hair style/colour/cut – shaved designs or dyed hair colours are not acceptable.

PE and Physical activities:

- No jewellery should be worn for PE or other sporting activities.
- No jewellery should be worn for swimming.
- If children cannot remove the jewellery themselves (for example: small studs) they should be covered with tape.

School Staff responsibilities:

- School staff will not assist children in removing or putting in earrings.
- Staff will not forcibly remove jewellery from children.
- Staff will ask children to remove any items of jewellery that are not allowed to be worn in school, staff will contact parents to discuss the matter.
- Staff/school will not be responsible for any jewellery that is brought into school by children.

MONITORING AND REVIEW

It is the responsibility of all staff to follow the principles stated in this policy. The Headmaster is responsible for reviewing this policy annually. This policy was written in September 2020. The next policy review will take place in September 2021.
